PAULA'S TUTORING EXPERIENCE

We asked our LVKC tutor, Paula Fish (right) about her experiences tutoring over the years since her introduction to the program in 2016. She shared her tutoring tips and her transition [tran-zish-uhn] to virtual tutoring.

"My experience with LVKC has been rewarding. I have had several students, but one student I have had for several years. And with that we have become friends, even though there are thirty years between us! I have learned so much about her culture, and that has been fun and interesting.

My best advice is to assess your student in the beginning and then formulate [fawr-myuh-leyt] a plan. I have used many resources at the library, and I have purchased learning books from book stores and online. For beginner students, I really emphasized 'syllable learning' for better pronunciation. For more advanced students that need more practice with Conversation, I planned projects for the student to present to me. An example being 'Around the World' presentations on culture, dance, food, and clothing. Then we would have a discussion on these topics.

We shared recipes from other countries and we both tried the recipes in our homes. My Japanese student shared her steamed chicken recipe, and I shared a recipe for Buttermilk Biscuits, which as become a staple in her home!

We played games like 'guess the word' where I gave clues and the student guessed the word. We did high school SAT words: definitions and putting in sentences.

Virtual learning was an easy transition. I used FaceTime if the student had an iPhone, or I used Zoom if they had an android phone. If I had a new student, I first had an 'in-person' get together, so we could connect on a more personal level, then we did Zoom after that. It worked out very well as virtual lessons were much more relaxing from home for both student and teacher. Try it! I think you will really enjoy it!

It has truly been a most rewarding experience to be able to work with so many people, learn about their lives, and share my life experiences with them. Tutors will feel fulfilled, while giving a unique individualized experience to your student! A win/win for all!" - Paula Fish
