HOLIDAY SEASON

The "holiday season" is a North American term that refers to the period of time between Thanksgiving and the New Year. This covers many of the holidays in American culture when most people in the USA and Canada are likely to travel back to their home or take time off to spend time with their family. Since we discussed Thanksgiving in our November Newsletter, we'll discuss the other holidays in the season.

Hanukkah

Hanukkah is a Jewish holiday that lasts for eight days and nights. In the 2nd Century BC, the Jewish people fought against the Seleucid Empire, who made Judaism illegal. Hanukkah celebrates the moment the Jewish fighters took back the Holy Temple in Jerusalem and were able to practice their religion again. Jews all over the world celebrate the festival by lighting candles in a traditional eight-branch candle holder called a Menorah, eating treats fried in oil and spending time with their families and communities.



Christmas

In Christianity, this is celebrated as the day Jesus Christ was born. A figure called Father Christmas / Santa Claus / St. Nicholas (depending on which country you are in) is thought to bring presents to children around the world on Christmas Eve. Today, many people, Christian or not, celebrate the holiday by having a big meal with their family and giving gifts to each other.



New Year's Eve

This is the last night of the old year and the beginning of a new one! Many people around the world celebrate by gathering with friends or family and stay up to "ring in the new year" by counting down to the start of the New Year to midnight, drink champagne and kiss the people around you.
